HEALTH AND SANITATION DEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATION  
IN THE NORTHEASTERN THAILAND

The Village Health and Sanitation Project was started in 1960 by the Department of Health, Ministry of Public Health with the assistance of the Agency for International Development (AID). This project is contributing directly and significantly to social and economic development by improving the physical and mental vigor of villagers, who are now burdened with filth—disease and parasitism, resulting from poor environmental sanitation.

The project is a nation wide, attacking on disease associated with poor sanitation which have become Thailand's most serious problem. The highest priority was being given to the development of this program in the fifteen provinces of the Northeastern Thailand, as it is the region in which the problem is most acute.

This thesis is intended to study how the program was going on during the first three years in the areas, and the author bases studying on the hypothesis that the administration of the Village Health and Sanitation Project was found not very satisfactory. Various obstacles and deficiencies of the project are to be analysed in this paper with a view to seek future improvement.
