ABSTRACT

Reflection of Government's Policy on News Broadcasting: An Analysis of Channel 11 News Discourse

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This research paper examines the role of a government-owned television network in creating positive image for the government by using linguistic strategies during news program. The research collected news genre from the evening news edition of Channel 11, a television network established and operated by the Royal Thai Government in 1933. The purpose of this study is to analyze the linguistic features used in the news genre relating to government activities and policies on the three southern provinces of Thailand. The Critical Discourse Analysis (CDA) framework is used to analyze the dimensions of social practice, production and consumption of text and text. In the stage of text analysis, the researcher adopts linguistic and lexical choices to respond to the research question of how the government-owned media strategically uses linguistic strategies to create positive image for the government.

This research paper does not attempt to provide the impact of the news genre on the society as whole. However, the study attempts to analyze the linguistic feature news scripts of the evening news edition of Channel 11. The study found that choices about the representation of actions, actors, events; active voice is apparently more frequently employed than the passive form of storytelling. An active voice in one event is represented as having an origin and a receiver, an agent and a patient. Also, choice about naming and wording; euphemism is a figurative expression which is used to avoid an offensive expression. The euphemism enhances the government's good image by rewording negative events into less objectionable ones. To increase creditability of the news, choice about incorporating and representing other voices is frequently employed to create reliability of information. For an analysis of lexical choice section, the study found that only wordings that contain positive meanings are employed in the news scripts in order to deliver messages from the government to the audience in a way that creates good image for the government.

The research paper can be summarized that the evening news edition of Channel 11 produced by the Public Relations Department (PRD) tends to utilize wordings that create

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positive image to the government in order to create public confidence and participation in dealing with the violence. In addition, a lack of transparency and communication by the government could lead to misunderstanding about the nature in the southern area, which can greatly damage the country's reputation if the government activities are misrepresented. Therefore, the PRD is serving its role as the mediator between the government and the public in ending the conflict in the southern area.

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
